Two new board members were elected at this meeting. Board President, Debra Marg, highlighted the Foundation’s activities and progress since organizing in November, 2013. In a few short months, the Foundation has established banking operations, marketing and fundraising plans, as well as policies and procedures that will provide consistency and guidance for future transactions.

Additionally, the Foundation has filed for, and been granted, tax-exempt status as a public charity under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).
